






Executive Summary



Executive Summary

With 1,558 students from 89 countries and 55 graduates to date, EBU has established itself as a global institution with local impact. Our strategic focus on poverty alleviation, quality education, gender equality, and partnerships has created an interconnected ecosystem of programs that address complex global challenges through collaborative action and innovative solutions.



SDG 1: No Poverty - Breaking Barriers Through Education

Our Approach: Financial Inclusion and Student Success Initiative

East Bridge University's commitment to ending poverty extends far beyond traditional educational boundaries. Our comprehensive Financial Inclusion and Student Success Initiative represents a holistic approach to poverty alleviation that recognizes education as both a fundamental right and a powerful tool for economic mobility.



SDG 1 Exact Data



Bottom Financial Quintile Access: We have successfully enrolled 312 students from the bottom 20% of household income groups, representing 20% of our 1,558 total enrollment. This targeted approach ensures that those who need education most have access to quality higher education opportunities.

Comprehensive Support Ecosystem: Our wraparound support system serves 467 students (30% of enrollment) with services including financial aid averaging \$2,975 per student. This holistic approach has achieved an exceptional 96% retention rate among supported students.

International Development Impact: Through specialized programs for 187 students from 40 low and lower-middle income countries, we have invested \$234,000 annually in global development. With a 93% completion rate and 71% of graduates returning to their home countries, our international students become agents of change in their communities.

Community Economic Development

Our local start-up assistance programs have created tangible economic impact in underserved communities. Operating through our centers in Paris, UK, India, Dubai, and Bangkok, we have:

- Supported 89 small business launches creating 267 direct jobs
- Provided entrepreneurship training to community members
- Facilitated access to microfinance and business development resources
- 🗸 Created mentorship networks connecting graduates with aspiring entrepreneurs

Community Services Access

We organize free training programs that improve access to basic services for community members, reaching 890 beneficiaries annually through workshops on digital literacy, financial planning, healthcare navigation, and legal rights awareness.

Measuring Impact

Among our 55 graduates, those from the bottom financial quintile demonstrate exceptional outcomes with 96% completion rates and average income increases of 280% within two years of graduation. Our comprehensive poverty alleviation efforts reach over 2,100 direct beneficiaries annually.






SDG 4: Quality Education - Education for Global Impact

Our Vision: Accessible, Inclusive, High-Quality Education

East Bridge University's commitment to SDG 4 is embodied in our "Education for Global Impact" mission. We believe that quality education should be accessible to all, regardless of background, location, or circumstances.

Global Lifelong Learning Initiative: Our comprehensive program provides free educational resources, professional development opportunities, and community outreach services to learners worldwide.

Educational Program Participation

Free Educational Resources Access: We provide comprehensive free access to educational resources for non-enrolled learners, including: - Learning Management System demo access serving over 14,000 monthly users - Professional webinar series reaching 4,890 global participants annually - Digital content repository with extensive educational materials - Dubai center facility access for study sessions, research, and community meetings.

Vocational Training Excellence: Through East Bridge Training (EBT), we host vocational training events serving 267 active students across KHDA-approved programs. Our executive education modules serve an additional 156 working professionals, with 89% achieving employment advancement within six months.

Educational Outreach Beyond Campus

Our extensive educational outreach activities demonstrate our commitment to community impact:

Professional Development Programs: We have delivered professional development sessions for 1,850 educators across schools in UAE, Malaysia, Nepal, India, Thailand, Sri Lanka, Myanmar, St. Lucia, and Philippines. These programs are led by our 67 graduate coordinators and student volunteers.

Childhood **Education: Early** Our specialized training for 234 early childhood educators Bangkok in represents our commitment to foundational education quality.

Community Workshops: Serving 2,340 beneficiaries annually, our community workshops address diverse educational needs from digital literacy to professional skills development.





Teaching Excellence and Quality Assurance

Among our 55 graduates, 17 are qualified to teach at primary school level, contributing to educational quality in their communities. We maintain high academic standards with 96% completion rates while pioneering innovative online and blended learning approaches.

Program Effectiveness Metrics

Our comprehensive evaluation demonstrates exceptional program quality: - Teaching Effectiveness: 94% of participants report improved effectiveness - New Strategies Implementation: 87% implement new strategies in classrooms - Further Development: 78% pursue additional professional development - Employment Advancement: 89% achieve career progression within 6 months.

Global Reach and Accessibility

Our inclusive access policy ensures educational activities are accessible regardless of ethnicity, religion, disability, immigration status, or gender. We provide: - Language support in 8 languages - Service to participants from 89 countries - Cultural adaptation services - Flexible scheduling.

Measuring Educational Impact

Our comprehensive metrics demonstrate exceptional value: - Total Beneficiaries: 49,800 individuals across all educational programs - Global Reach: 89 countries with culturally adapted programming - Cost-Effectiveness: \$12.26 per beneficiary across all programs - Participant Satisfaction: 4.5/5.0 average rating - Skill Acquisition: 92% demonstrate measurable improvement.






SDG 5: Gender Equality - Creating Inclusive Excellence

Our Commitment: Comprehensive Gender Equality

East Bridge University's approach to gender equality encompasses all aspects of our institution, from student access and academic progression to leadership representation and workplace policies.

Women in Leadership Excellence: Our flagship Women in Leadership and STEM Excellence Program has achieved remarkable results in gender representation. With 58% of our senior academic staff being women (29 out of 50 positions), we demonstrate our commitment to gender balance in leadership.

Gender Representation Analysis

Leadership and Academic Achievement: Our commitment to gender equality is reflected across multiple dimensions:

- Senior Academic Staff: 58% women (29 out of 50 positions)
- Total Graduates: 47% women (26 out of 55 graduates)
- Female Students Starting Degrees: 648 female students

First-Generation Women Support: We actively support 296 first-generation women among our 648 female students starting degrees. Our targeted outreach and support programs ensure that women from families without higher education experience receive comprehensive guidance and mentoring.

Graduate Success Across Disciplines

Our commitment to gender equality is reflected in graduate outcomes across diverse fields:

Graduate Distribution by Field (Women): Arts & Humanities/Social Sciences: 22 women graduates (84% of women graduates) - STEM Fields: 3 women graduates (12% of women graduates) - Medicine and Health Sciences: 1 woman graduate (4% of women graduates)





Comprehensive Support Systems

Leadership and Academic Achievement: Our commitment to gender equality is reflected across multiple dimensions:

Women's Support Programs: First-Generation Women: 296 participants receiving specialized support - Mentoring Programs: Over 10% of female students in dedicated mentoring - Systematic tracking of women's application rates, acceptance rates, and participation

Family-Friendly Policies: Comprehensive family support including maternity policies, free childcare facilities for staff and faculty, and paternity policies that enable fathers to participate in childcare duties.

Non-Discrimination Framework: Robust policies ensuring non-discrimination against women and transgender individuals, creating a safe and inclusive environment for all gender identities.



Global Cultural Sensitivity


With students from 89 countries, we address gender equality within diverse cultural contexts, providing culturally sensitive support while maintaining our commitment to fundamental equality principles. We maintain our 96% completion rate across all gender groups.

Our Philosophy: Amplifying Impact Through Partnership

East Bridge University recognizes that achieving the Sustainable Development Goals requires collaborative action across sectors, borders, and disciplines. Our commitment to SDG 17 reflects our belief that meaningful partnerships amplify impact and create sustainable solutions.

Global SDG Partnership Network: Our comprehensive partnership network spans 58 organizations including governments, NGOs, and academic institutions across multiple regions. With 18 organizations already engaged, our network facilitates knowledge exchange and coordinates joint initiatives.

Partnership Network Scale

Educational Partnerships: Current collaborations extend to countries such as Myanmar, Vietnam, and Sri Lanka, where our focus is on professional development for low-income groups. We host and participate in events across Thailand, Laos, the Philippines, India, and Nepal.

Cross-Sectoral Dialogue Leadership: EBU initiates and participates in cross-sectoral dialogue about the SDGs through international conferences, policy forums, and multistakeholder workshops.

International Best Practice Development: Through international collaboration and research partnerships, we work with universities in 23 countries currently, enabling comparative analysis of SDG implementation strategies.

Student and Community Engagement

Student Participation in Collaborative Initiatives: Student Volunteering: 100+ students engaged annually in NGO collaboration programs - SDG Education: All 1,558 students receive mandatory SDG education - Dedicated SDG Courses: 423 students annually in specialized sustainability programs - Community Outreach: 2,890 community members reached through educational activities





Comprehensive SDG Integration

Curriculum Integration: We maintain mandatory SDG education for all 1,558 students, with sustainability and SDG concepts integrated throughout our full curriculum.

Specialized Programs: Our dedicated sustainability and SDG courses serve 423 students annually across undergraduate and graduate levels, preparing students for careers in sustainable development.

Community Outreach: We provide dedicated outreach educational activities reaching 2,890 community members annually through workshops, seminars, and capacity-building initiatives.



Technology-Enhanced Partnership

We leverage digital platforms and innovative technologies to facilitate global partnerships, including virtual collaboration tools, online knowledge sharing platforms, and Al-powered matching systems that connect partners with complementary expertise and resources.

Regional Hub Leadership

EBU serves as a regional hub for SDG coordination, facilitating connections between partners, sharing resources and expertise, and providing leadership in multi-stakeholder initiatives across the Middle East, Southeast Asia, and South Asia regions.
