Policy Statement

The policy aims to set out the eligibility criteria of how and when Recognition of Prior Learning can be applied for a student willing to enroll in a particular course. It creates and provides a structure and guideline for East Bridge University when it comes to the application of RPL.

To Whom The Policy Applies

The policy applies to all the students of East Bridge University.

Policy and Procedures

Definition: The Regulatory Arrangements for the Qualifications and Credit Framework (QCF) defines Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) as “a method of assessment that considers whether a learner can demonstrate that they can meet the assessment requirements for a unit through knowledge, understanding, or skills that they already possess and do not need to develop through a course of learning.

Understanding Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL): RPL is the use of a learner's prior learning records and documentation for the admission process of a related course. Initially, the admission counselor determines if the applicant's learning records and supporting documentation suffice to demonstrate that they meet the requirements for the course for which they are applying. For final approval, the decision of the Academic Manager is considered.

RPL Requirements: For Certificate and Diploma-level courses, the applicant should have an "A" level qualification or a High School Diploma or equivalent. The RPL requirement for Postgraduate courses is a Bachelor's Degree from an accredited university.
